

The Putnam County Library strives to provide events that appeal to a broad audience of all ages. All events are free and open to the public.

Regularly Scheduled Events

Family Movie Night—Come by for an all-ages movie on the library projection screen. This month: *Mary Poppins Returns* PG

First Friday Book Club—A monthly book discussion for adults. This month's title is *Between Shades of Gray* by Ruta Sepetys.

Homeschool Hangout—A place for kids to come hangout, work on different skills, and have some fun! Recommended for preschool aged children and up.

Lego Club—Ages 5 and Up (Strict, due to small parts) We provide the blocks, you provide the creativity. Children under age 10 must remain accompanied by an adult.

Mind Sports Club—Learn to play Go, Chess, and other mind sports games, and find fellow competitors to help you hone your skills. This program is a partnership with the American Go Foundation and is open to all ages.

Preschool Crafts—A drop in session of fun kids crafts, starting just as soon as Story Time wraps up.

Read!Play!Grow! - Ages birth-3 years. Part baby bounce, part literacy minded play, part early literacy education, and a whole lotta fun!

Sensory Story Time—An interactive and educational program that can be enjoyed by all children, but is especially designed for young children with sensory integration challenges. Recommended for preschool aged children.

Story Time with Mrs. Donovan— Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays at 10am in the Story Time Room.

Teen Creator Space—We provide the tools, you provide the imagination. A place to make things and hang out with others who enjoy doing the same. Open to ages 12-17.

Teen Gaming Club— Play cards, conquer kingdoms, and outwit friends! Retro video games provided. Open to teens ages 12-17.

Teen Sketch Club— All teens and all abilities welcome! Enjoy sharing sketches and art games.

Twice Told Tales Book Sale— Used book sale hosted by the Putnam County Library Friends. Proceeds benefit the library.

Upper Cumberland Community Meditation Program—Join us for a guided meditation as we explore the inner recesses of our own minds and leave all our stress behind us. You will thank yourself afterwards.

V.I.P. Program— A program that offers art, games, movies, and yoga for all adult patrons with accommodations for those with special needs.

Special Events

Game Night—Come by for a mid-week game break. We will have out the library's gaming collection, chock full of great board and card games, but feel free to bring any personal favorites as well. Card, board, tabletop, rpg...all are welcome!
Free to attend, recommended for ages 16 and up.

Computer Ed—A year long program series presenting standalone courses taught by professional instructors, each with a different subject matter. This month's courses: 20th: Social Media (Twitter), 26th: Library Resources.

Read to a Therapy Dog—Bring your favorite story to share with Roz the therapy dog and her owner LuAnne Chavez!

Sketch Table—A roundtable social event for artists of all levels and styles, with an emphasis on drawing, doodling, cartooning, and sketching. A great chance to work on a project out of the studio while meeting other art-minded folks. Open to ages 18 and up, refreshments provided.

Story Time with an Author—Local author, Rebecca Marriott Stout will be here for a special story time with her book, *Flutterby: The Fantabulous Butterfly*. Join us for a meet and greet and special activity to follow! All ages welcome!

Sundown Story Time—Join us as we explore different ways to wind down the school and work day with stories, songs, movement, activities, and more! This new program is designed to engage and encourage lifelong readers of all ages, with a special focus on activities for our school aged friends. Children and their adults will be encouraged to be active participants during this program.

Teen Hangout—Teens are invited to come hang out, watch a movie, and play games for our special 5th Tuesday event.

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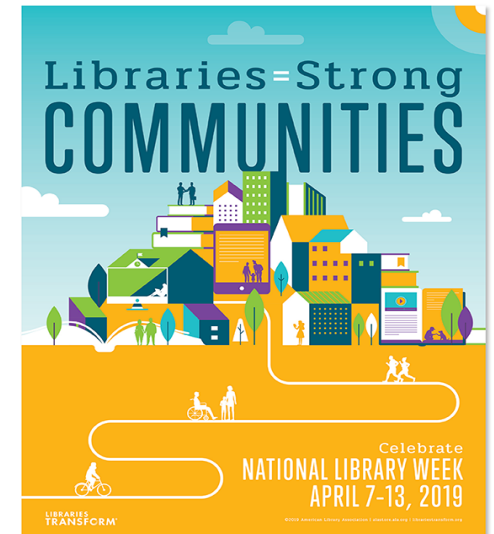
